Project Management Update from Kosovo

Introduction

Republic of Kosovo declared its independence on February 2008. Since then, many remarkable achievements have been recorded such as establishing democratic institutions, promoting human rights and rule of law and other democratic values.

Creating a supportive environment to private sector growth was one of the key objectives of Government of Kosovo (GoK) and international community acting in Kosovo. Several private sectors flourished during the last decade including construction, as one of the fastest growing sectors since after the War (1999). Kosovo was almost completely destroyed during the last War; it had to be rebuilt and is well heading toward it. Most common types of projects have been rebuilding or building new houses, roads, schools, etc. supported by both local investors (including GoK) and international donors in terms of finances and technical assistance.

PM Profession News

Managing professionally investment projects and programs of all sizes became a crucial issue in Kosovo. It was not only a need but also it became a serious tool to succeed in a

fairly competitive environment. Several local private companies have been successfully competing against international ones. Project Management is taught and lectured not only in the public university (University of Prishtina) but also in several private universities and colleges bringing advanced concepts and tools to better manage projects and programs.

Republic of Kosovo after a long fight became a member of International Project Management Association, based in Switzerland. Kosovo is now member and familiar with project management events and practices happening in the world.

TenStep, Inc¹, in close cooperation with Genius Consulting², both US based consulting companies, decided to open a TenStep chapter in Kosovo, TenStep Kosovo³ (TSK). TSK is the pioneer consulting, training and offering unique project management methodology in Project Management also representing a new level of international expertise in Project Management. Project Updates – News from some Important Projects

Today several world scale projects are going on in Kosovo. These projects are at different implementation stages. Among many of them, I have chosen the following:

- a) 'Kosova e Re', a brand new power plant to be build in Kosovo
- b) Highway to be developed, from Morine (Kosovo – Albania border) toward Merdare (Kosovo – Serbian border)
- c) GoK decided to put in concession tender Prishtina International Airport
- d) Privatization of Post and Telecom of Kosova (PTK)

'Kosova e Re' will be by far the largest investment project in the energy sector in Kosovo, Balkan and wider. First it was projected to be 2100 MW/h, costing about € 3,5 billion. In November 2009, Ministry of Energy and Mines decided to re-advertise the same tender again. The design, size and structure of the second tender will be slightly different from the first one. Nowadays, GoK and international actors are discussing imperatives of the new tender.

The new power plant will have a capacity of over 1,000 megawatts. It might be built in two phases with 500 megawatts each, or in three phases with 300 megawatts per phase; however, this issue is expected to be decided by the investor said Mrs. Justina Pula – Shiroka, the Minister of Energy of Mines week ago, at the Project Steering Committee. Power plant blocks will be developed one after the other depending on the consumption needs in Kosovo and in the region. Kosovo has preconditions to become main energy provider in the region in short future. More information is available at www.ks-gov.net



Highway Morine – Merdare is considered as second largest project after the War and one of the key projects to help the economy growth in Kosovo. The tender to build the highway is advertized and the winner is expected to be selected in December 2009. It is calculated that the highway will cost about € 650 millions; it will be funded through a cost sharing structure between GoK and World Bank which promised to partially finance it. Expropriation of private land has begun for some time, not finished yet.

This highway is about 117 km long, containing about 20 bridges of various sizes and will be build based on high road construction standards. More information interested parties can get at www.mtpt.org/



Prishtina International Airport (PIA) for many years has only marked progress and success in its business. Over one million passengers travelled through PIA in about 9 months (Jan 2009 – Sep 2009). In June 2006, Pristina International Airport was awarded the Best Airport 2006 Award, an honor presented by [Airports Council International](#) (ACI). PIA is successfully fulfilling required international standards. GoK has decided to concession through a public – private partnership tender to find someone who is interested to invest further in PIA and increase the scope of operations and further modernize services. An international consulting company has been selected to support the entire process. The tender is advertized and several international well experienced companies has shown strong interest. Another success story is PTK having about a million clients and was categorized as one of the most successful publicly owned enterprise. GoK decided to privatize PTK as it will further increase the social welfare of clients by offering better services and prices to end users. PTK is now in process of preparing the scope and model of privatization process and approach. Another independent consulting and evaluation international company was contracted some time ago to evaluate the overall PTK value. Its assets value increases continuously by offering a large number of services and expanding the network. PTK entered in Albanian mobile market providing an added value to Kosovar clients. Other News Affecting Projects & PM in Kosovo

The Republic of Kosova haa successfully passed the first democracy test. On Nov 15th, 2009 Kosovars for the first time after independence, organized free municipal elections. These elections have been entirely organized and thus held responsible by Kosovar institutions. One of the biggest results from these elections was the increased percentage of Kosovar Serbs participating in elections to elect Kosovar institutions. This was a significant progress in terms of future development and joint cooperation. All international monitoring bodies (like Council of Europe, OSCE, European Parliament, EU Commission, etc) have unanimously congratulated Kosovo and Kosovars on this remarkable democracy achievement.
